A NOTE FROM ELMO, KAT, AND CINCO COMPTON

Hi! Thanks for considering a Mission Trip to Peru! We have been full-time missionaries to Peru since Spring of '13 and absolutely love what we get to do! The desire to see people trust in the name of Jesus drives everything that we do. We believe that the local church is the preferred vehicle that God uses to bring the Gospel to the lost and everything we do is based on the local church.

We also believe that selfless serving is one of the best ways to bridge the gap and create opportunities to present the Gospel. Mosaico Church

We planted Mosaico Church in mid-2016. It is in a modestly upscale neighborhood that is one of the least churched neighborhoods in all of Peru.

We meet weekly on Sunday evenings and we also have a mid-week bible study. You will come alongside us as we minister to the people of Mosaico and as we host outreaches. There are tens of thousands of people within walking distance of Mosaico that haven't heard the Gospel.

ORPHANAGES



We work with several homes for at-risk and abandoned girls. Our goal is to help turn these orphanages into places of refuge for those who have lost all hope after enduring impossibly difficult situations of abuse and mistreatment. We strive to provide the girls of these homes with a home where they can learn how to recover from their pasts. We help them learn to forgive as they have been forgiven and to love as Jesus loves them. You will forever be impacted by your time spent with our girls

BACKPACKS

There are thousands of children that live below the poverty line here in Lima and most of them go to school ill-prepared and without school supplies. Our goal for 2018 is to give out 3,000 backpacks full of school supplies and you will get to be a part of changing the lives and education of the children that receive these backpacks!



WHEELCHAIRS



There are thousands in Peru that do not have the ability to transport themselves. If we follow the example of Jesus, we need to have compassion for the "Least of these".

We partner with Free Wheelchair Mission and Camino de Vida to give mobility to those who need it, most for the first time. There is no better time to serve someone than the moment they look at you with tears in their eyes and the question "Why" on their lips. You will never forget that moment. We Promise.



FAQ'S



1. Do I need a passport?

Yes. If you are leaving the United States, you will need a passport that has an expiration date 6 months beyond the travel date of your trip.

2. Are there additional expenses?

Depends. Your trip budget covers all of your expenses from when we pick you up at the airport to when we drop you back off. You will need money for souvenirs and any "extras" that you might like.

3. Can I use my credit/debit card while in Peru?

Yes, in a lot of places. You must notify your bank of your travel plans and we always ask that you have a backup plan just in case your card doesn't work or is lost/stolen.

4. Do I need vaccinations for traveling on my trip?

All of our trips are based in the city of Lima and most diseases requiring vaccines within Peru are found in the jungle. Although anything is possible, it is very unlikely that you will encounter problems in Lima. Please consult your physician for more information.

5. Do I need to speak Spanish?

No. You will be surprised at how much you are able to communicate without a common language. However, it is always helpful if you can speak Spanish! We also provide translators whenever necessary.

6. What's up with the food? What will I be eating?

Peru's food has been ranked as some of the best in the world. You will eat well while in Lima! Please let us know about any diet restrictions or allergies before you arrive and we will do our best to accommodate you.

7. Can I take a shower? What about drinking water?

Yes, you will be able to shower, but the showers can be much different than U.S. standards. The rule with drinking water is to stick to bottled water unless it comes directly from us.

FAQ'S

8. Will I be safe with you?

Safety is very important to us. We have been leading trips for years and none of our team members have experienced a major incident of crime. While crime is possible, we take precautions to ensure your safety. We are always with the team throughout the trip from arrival at the airport to departure.

9. Do I need to have health/travel insurance?

We do not require that you have travel insurance, but it is highly recommended. Please note that all medical expenses are the responsibility of the individual.

10. What type of transportation will I use?

You will use a variety of different transportation methods. We balance safety with allowing you to experience the Peruvian culture firsthand.

11. Will I make a difference?

Absolutely! One of the great things about going on a mission trip is seeing God use you and your abilities to meet specific needs.

12. What will I do on my mission trip?

Each trip is different and even two trips to the same country will include different projects and ministry opportunities. Our mission trips usually range from ministry to children to construction projects, to teaching English, to leading Bible studies. All of the trips are hands-on and require every team member to be involved – no spectators!

13. What if I get sick?

We strive to make sure that you stay healthy during your trip; however, if you get sick, you will have access to medical attention. It is always wise (and highly recommended) that you pack basic medical supplies such as prescription medicine and OTC anti-diarrheal. 14. Will I have Internet access during my trip to post on Facebook?

Maybe. Much of Peru does not have easy access to the Internet so we cannot guarantee that you will have reliable access.
